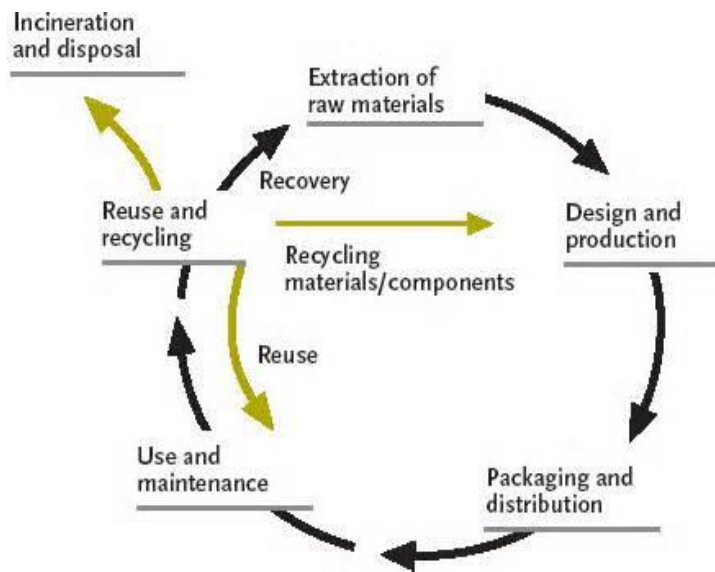


Minnesota Product Stewardship Council: the go-to independent organization for product stewardship information in Minnesota.











Product Stewardship is a system in which those who design and make products take primary responsibility for managing their product throughout its lifecycle.

Why Product Stewardship action is important:

- When producers are involved in managing their products through end-of-life, it can lead to better product design, better service to customers, less impact on the environment, and lower costs
- Effective product stewardship programs reduce the generation of waste, increase recycling rates, and reduce government spending and involvement
- Using private sector efficiencies helps reduce the overall cost of recycling while creating economic opportunities, including jobs
